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Aim of Program	The aim of this program is to expand the possibilities for students from the partner institutions in German-speaking area, who are strongly interested in learning Japanese language as well as deepening their knowledge about Japan comparing with Germany and Europe. For this purpose, applicants will not be required of any academic standard, but will be expected to learn Japanese language intensively. Besides Japanese language courses, Department of German Studies offers courses, where German and Japanese students study together and mutually enhance their knowledge linguistically as well as academically one another.

COURSE GUIDE

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Available courses	 Intercultural courses offered by Department of German Studies (taught in German & Japanese) German-Japanese Exchange students are required to take at least one course from the Department of German Studies. Japanese Language courses offered by the Center for Language Education and Research (see below) English-taught courses in Faculty of Foreign Studies: It is required to meet the Language requirements set by each Faculty and students must submit a copy of language certificate at the time of course registration. English-taught courses in Faculty of Liberal Arts (FLA), Faculty of Science and Technology (FST): TOEFL iBT 79, TOEFL PBT 550, IELTS 6.0, TOEIC730, or Cambridge English C2 Proficiency (CPE) or C1 Advanced (CAE) Japanese-taught courses in the Departments other than the Department of German Studies: N1 of the JLPT may be required (depends on the Department) *It may be necessary to consult with instructor and obtain the permission beforehand to take some courses. *Japanese language courses are not mandatory, but strongly recommended. *Graduate courses are NOT available. *Bulletin is updated in March every year. Course offer and syllabi may vary each year. Please refer to the latest information available online.
Japanese Language Course	The Center for Language Education and Research provides multiple tracks and levels of Japanese language courses according to students' needs and linguistic backgrounds. Students who wish to attend Japanese class can choose from regular track or intensive track. Students who have prior Japanese study experience will be placed to appropriate class level according to the result of Japanese placement test. http://www.sophia-cler.jp/study/ja/lesson.html Regular Track (4 credits) The regular track offers beginning, intermediate to advanced courses where 100-minutes classes meet four or five times per week. This course aims to focus on developing communicative competence through extensive practices by integrating four skills, listening, speaking, reading and writing. English is occasionally used for instruction as necessary. Intensive Track (8 credits) Intensive Japanese trrack, which offers four-level intensive courses at beginning, intermediate, and advanced levels, is designed for students whose main purpose of coming to Japan is to study Japanese. Classes meet for three hours a day through Monday to Friday. Fifteen hours of class time per week allow students to spend sufficient time to gain the high level of Japanese proficiency. English is occasionally used for instruction as necessary.
Registration Requirements	*Exchange students must register and attend more than 10 hours of classes per week. To fulfill this requirement, attending at least 6 periods (100 minutes constitute one period) every week is necessary. •FLA core programs, FST laboratory classes, the foreign language courses (except Japanese language), seminars, compulsory courses in General Studies, "Studies in Christian Humanism: For Others, with Others", "Liberal Arts of the Body", "Critical Thinking & Writing", "Overview of Data Science", "Thinking about Issues, Perspectives and Positionality" are NOT open to exchange students. •Exchange students should choose most courses from the departments/graduate program that he/she enrolled in.
