He is in pre-production on The Last Tree, by British-Nigerian newcomer Shola Amoo and developing Number9Dream, based on David Mitchell's Japan set novel with Oscar winning director Asif Kapadia (Amy, Senna) and, a UK-Japan set supernatural thriller.
