The session also invites others who work in global health and health policy and the audience to interact with Dr. Agyepong to deepen understanding and widen perspectives on the issue.

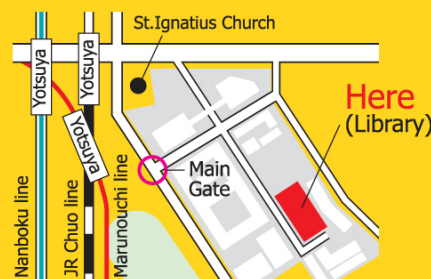
